Irregular Verbs

To form the past tense form of most verbs, you simpled add -ed to the end of the word.

Present tense: I <u>walk</u> to the cafe.
Past tense: I <u>walked</u> to the cafe.

Irregular verbs are a bit more difficult because you don't add -ed to make them past tense. The whole word changes depending on its tense.

Present tense: I <u>eat</u> a carrot. Past tense: I <u>ate</u> a carrot.
