Use *there is* for singular nouns (one item)

a cap

there is



There is milk in the kitchen.

Use *there is* for non-count items



milk



water



cheese

there are



There are four bees in the kitchen.

Use *there are* to talk about two or more things



bees



mummies



caps

We use *there is (there's)* and *there are*

when we want to say that something exists (or does not exist)



There is a chick in the box.



There are chicks in the box.
